Shibuya Transforms into Digital Art Hub: DIG SHIBUYA 2026 Announces Official Program

- A City-Wide Art & Technology Festival Featuring Over 30 Programs Across Shibuya

Shibuya, Tokyo — 22nd December 2025

The SHIBUYA CREATIVE TECH Committee, in collaboration with Shibuya City, is pleased to announce the official program highlights of **DIG SHIBUYA 2026**, a three-day art and technology festival taking place from February 13 to February 15, 2026, across the Shibuya area.



- Building on its role as a platform where art, technology, and urban culture intersect, **DIG SHIBUYA 2026 will present more than 30 programs throughout the city**—ranging from large-scale public performances and digital art exhibitions to live music, AI-driven creative experiments, talks, workshops, and meet-ups with artists and startups from Japan and abroad.
- This press release introduces **a selection of representative programs** from the official lineup, highlighting key projects that embody the spirit and scope of DIG SHIBUYA 2026.

DIG SHIBUYA 2026 invites audiences to experience cutting-edge culture simply by walking through the city—where streets become theaters, urban screens turn into galleries, and technology opens new forms of artistic expression embedded in everyday life.

Highlights:

1. DIG SHIBUYA THEATRON - A One-Day Urban Theater on Park Avenue by ALTEMY

For one day only, Shibuya's iconic Park Avenue transforms into an open-air urban theater. With partial traffic control, the street becomes a 360-degree performance space where passersby naturally turn into both audience and performers.

Produced by PARCO and featuring music direction by acclaimed producer Shuta Hasunuma, this large-scale non-verbal performance explores the theme "From Street to Theater — A Prelude to the Future of Shibuya." The project reimagines public space as a site where everyday life and art intersect.

2. SCREENS CONTEXTUALIZED - Digital Public Art Across Urban Screens

Digital signage across Shibuya—from large-scale building screens to small street-corner displays—will host works by **over 40 artists**, transforming the city into a distributed exhibition space.

By focusing on each screen's *historical, spatial, and social context*, the program layers digital public art onto Shibuya's accumulated urban narratives, revealing new "contexts" of the city through art encountered in daily movement.

3. AI x Literature - "Drawing a Novel with Vocal Cords" — AI Masaya Nakahara

An experimental literary project where visitors co-author stories through voice dialogue with an AI trained on the complete works of **Masaya Nakahara**, recipient of the Mishima Prize.

Text generated through real-time vocal interaction is visualized instantly, creating a form of *live literature*—a constantly evolving narrative shaped by human-AI collaboration.

4. **RADIO SAKAMOTO – “Uday” A Night Where the Future of Music Emerges**

A future-oriented music festival inheriting the spirit of Ryuichi Sakamoto, reimagining Shibuya as a city where new sounds are born. Featuring international and Japanese artists across genres, the program positions Shibuya as a site where music, technology, and new cultural contexts intersect.

5. **DIG SHIBUYA 2026 Opening Event & Meet-Up; Artists, Startups, and Creative Technology**

An opening event bringing together international artists, creators, and creative-tech startups through talks, pitch sessions, and hands-on workshops.

Among the highlights is a **hands-on workshop led by Korean digital artist Seo Hyojung**, who **co-created the visual identity and logo of DIG SHIBUYA 2026**. The workshop offers participants an opportunity to explore motion and generative visual design, reflecting the creative process behind DIG SHIBUYA’s symbolic visual language.

The event underscores DIG SHIBUYA’s role not only as a festival, but as a **platform for cross-border collaboration, learning, and experimentation in creative technology**.

6. **11 Innovative Collaborations**

This year’s selection brings together **11 projects chosen from an international open call**, which attracted approximately **60 submissions from Europe, the United States, Asia, Japan, and other regions**. Following a review process led by a panel of five experts, the selected works represent a diverse range of artistic approaches that push the boundaries of sensory and urban experience.

From bio-art installations presenting “*Dragon Meat*” created through cutting-edge biotechnology, to “*The Unmanned Orchestra*,” which places visitors inside a multi-layered soundscape, the programme spans AI-driven film experiments, sound-led urban quests, location-based digital art that reimagines *Ukiyo-e* through pixel craft, and speculative visions of Shibuya in the year 2226 shaped by climate change.

Together, these works invite audiences to **touch, listen, wander, and imagine**—transforming the city into a playground for art, technology, and the senses, and offering new ways to explore Shibuya through creative experimentation.
